



2023 WWSA State Championship
Revised rules for this competition

- All half time intervals will be 10 minutes
- All overtimes by WWSA Cup rules. Overtime half will be 2 minutes
- U12 small sided goals shall be 6 X 18
- No team shall wear the logo, insignia, or other identifying mark of a non-US Youth Soccer organization on their uniforms during the Region I Championships. A manufacturer's mark or sponsor's name or logo is exempted. Teams wearing such items shall either remove the mark, change uniforms to comply with this rule, or forfeit each match of the competition
- Substitutions
 - Substitutions may be made, with the consent of the referee, at any stoppage of play
 - For the Under 14 and younger age groups, unlimited substitutions shall be allowed; and
 - For all other age groups, a maximum of 7 substitutions for each team shall be allowed in each game during each half and during any overtime play. After leaving the game during a half of play, the substituted player may not re-enter the game during the same half of play. After leaving the game during overtime play, the substituted player may not re-enter the game
- Referee procedure for limited substitution: Team retains pass cards for all players on that game's roster (18 players Maximum). When the game begins, the eleven starters will give the team side Assistant Referee (or 4th Official if one is appointed to the match) their cards. On any subsequent substitution, the player must take his card to the halfway line and give it to the team side AR (or 4th Official if one is appointed to the match) after the player being replaced has left the field. A maximum of seven substitutions can be made in each half or overtime. At the end of the half, all cards will be returned to the team, and the procedure is repeated in the second half, and repeated again if overtime is needed.
- Concussion Protocol
"If a player is suspected of suffering a head injury they may be substituted for evaluation without the substitutions counting against the team's total number of allowed substitutions during each half or overtime period. If the player with the suspected head injury has received clearance from the event's "Health Care Professional", the player may re-enter at any stoppage of play. The evaluated player must replace the original substitute and will not count as a substitution. The temporary substituted player may re-enter the game as a regular substitute. A team may only make a temporary substitution if they have a substitution available".
